

EPA 6: Provide an oral presentation/summary of a patient encounter (Minter/Rosenfield)

1. Description of the activity	<p>The day 1 resident should be able to concisely present a summary of a patient encounter to achieve a shared understanding of the patient’s current condition to one or more members of the health care team (including patients and families). A pre-requisite for the ability to provide an oral presentation is synthesis of the information gathered into an accurate assessment of the patient’s current condition.</p> <p>Bulleted List of Functions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Present information that has been personally gathered or verified, acknowledging any areas of uncertainty. • Provide an accurate, concise, and well- organized oral presentation. • Adjust the oral presentation to meet the needs of the receiver of the information. • Assure closed-loop communication between presenter and receiver of the information to assure that both parties have a shared understanding of the patient’s condition and needs.
